1. What is City Bound?

City Bound Europe Network gathers youth organisations from from all over Europe connected by the common aim of building integrated European society. To achieve it, we organise City Bound youth exchanges for young people in age 14-17 in different cities significant for Europen identity. Our work is based on nonformal education methodology with a special focus on adventure- based learning.

Aims of the Network:

- To build confidence in the idea of "United Europe" among young people and help them to understand the concept of Europe based on tolerance, inclusion and understanding and preventing radicalization of young people, by creating an opportunity for building opinions based on personal experience and face to face contact.
- To provide a space for personal growth of young people from all over Europe and support them in the transition from childhood to adulthood by developing their social and civic competences and preparing them to live in intercultural society.
- To rise creativity of participants and support them to discover their full potential by providing innovative non-formal education opportunities especially focused on adventure-based learning methodology.

2. Why to join the Academy of Change Makers?

In order to implement high-quality youth exchanges we created a team of youth leaders that are facilitating variety activities and supporting young participants in their City Bound Adventure. The team develops rapidly therefore every year we provide a training for new leaders who wants to join us.

The training is a first step to become a youth leader and it aims to develop competences of young leaders and activists in designing and facilitating learning programs, that are based on the needs of young people and lead to a meaningful change.

3. Who can participate in the event?

This training course is directed to youth leaders, who took part in the first edition of Academy of Change makers or Basic Training Course of City Bound. Youth leaders of previous City Bound exchanges or those who are planning to become national leaders for upcoming City Bound exchanges are also welcomed.

Each country should send 3 youth leaders (18+ years old).

3. Where the Training will take place?

Venue

Project will take place in Abenteuerzentrum im Grunewald, Eicchörncheinsteig 3, Berlin. More information about project site can be found here:

Abenteuerzentrum im Grunewald It is a typical youth centre, so conditions are not that good as in the hotel, but enough to spend great time together and have lots of fun! Whole Centre will be only for us, so we can enjoy it all night long! Rooms will be nationally-mixed, and divided according to the gender. Place is very close to the centre of Berlin, it's very easy to get there any time by public transport.

HOW TO GET THERE?

From BRANDENBURG airport:

Find the S-bahn station Flughafen BER (city train in Berlin). There take the train S45 (direction S Südkreuz) and go to the last station Südkreuz. In Südkreuz change to the train number S41 (direction Ring) and get to the station Halensee. There you need to walk out of the station (there is only one exit) and cross the street in order to get the bus X10 (direction Teltow Stadt) or M29 (Direction Roseneck). By this bus get to the bus stop Roseneck/Teplitzer Strasse. You are almost there, just follow the map below (12 minutes walking).

From HAUPTBAHNHOF:

You need to take train S5 or S7 (direction Spandau or Potsdam) to Zoologische Garten and then bus X10 (direction Teltow Stadt). By this bus get to the bus stop Roseneck/Teplitzer Strasse. You are almost there, just follow the map (12 minutes walking).

From ZOB (ZENTRALER OMNIBUSBAHNHOF) – Central Bus Station:

You need to take the bus 104 (Direction Zoologische Garten) to the bus stop Halensee. Then you need to cross the street in order to get the bus X10 (direction Teltow Stadt) or M29 (Direction Roseneck). By this bus get to the bus stop Roseneck/Teplitzer Strasse. You are almost there, just follow the map (12 minutes walking).

TICKET:

If you are traveling from the BER airport you need to buy a ticket for zones ABC (4,4 EUR). If you arrive to main train station or ZOB you need to buy a AB ticket (3,5 EUR). Those ticket are valid for 2h regardless how many changes you have on the way.





Project is financed under the "ERASMUS+ Programme, Key Action 1. 100% of accommodation and activity costs are covered by the programme.

The international travel costs are covered according to the rules of ERASMUS+ Programme. Plan your travel to Germany according to the budget given in the table below.

That means that your travel costs will be fully reimbursed up to the limit, what should be enough to get to Berlin from all participating countries – therefore we expect that everybody will get back 100% of the travel. If you spend less for your travel you will get exactly the amount you spent. If you spend more, you will get the amount from the table.

- ... and lots of smiles and motivation!


